



I-405 Renton to Bellevue Widening and Express Toll Lanes Project (Renton to Bellevue)

Bid awarded on Oct. 1

Flatiron West Inc.-The Lane Construction Corporation Joint Venture was Apparent Best Value

- Bid price: \$704.9 million
- Maintains commitments to meeting partner schedules

Renton to Bellevue: Eastrail regional trail – King County partnership

As part of the I-405 Renton to Bellevue Widening and Express Toll Lanes project, WSDOT is working closely with King County to build portions of the Eastrail regional trail. The project includes the following elements:

- Builds a 2.5 mile segment of paved trail south of I-90
- Extends the paved trail between Coal Creek Parkway in south Bellevue and Ripley Lane in Renton
- Replaces sections of existing Lake Washington Loop trail
- Builds a new crossing over southbound I-405



37-mile corridor: Lynnwood to Burien


- 11 BRT stations across 8 cities
- 3 new/expanded parking facilities
- 1 transit center
- Estimated 15,000-18,000 riders daily by 2040





I-405 BRT travel times

AM peak hour travel times to Bellevue



South Line – Burien to Bellevue	
ST Express (existing)	55 MIN
ST3 representative project*	45-49 MIN
I-405 BRT proposed refined project*	38-42 MIN

*Preliminary travel time estimates for planning purposes, subject to change. Existing travel times are average times. Year 2025 estimates assume new express toll lanes are open between Renton to Bellevue. Updated information will be provided prior to beginning service.




Project station area

Future Compatibility – HCT Study


- High Capacity Transit Study to connect Renton to LRT approved in ST3

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


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


BRT Routing: Talbot vs. Rainier

- AM peak shows high delays along Talbot & along Grady
- Access via Rainier is recommended for all times of day
