### Police receive reports of email scam

Renton police have been receiving reports of an email scam that indicates the victim is guilty of speeding or running a red light. The email includes a link to view a video of the incident, pay the fine, or contest the violation. This officiallooking email may even have convincing details, including street names, speed limits, and/or date and time of the violation.

The department wants to remind residents that any such violation notice is mailed to the vehicle's registered owner. No email is sent.

Please be vigilant and follow these simple rules:

- Do not click links in an email from anyone you do not know.
- If you receive a suspicious email, even from a company you know, hold your cursor over the recipient's email address. It may not read out as an address you recognize.
- If you have any misgivings about an email, go to the official website or phone that person/company to verify the email.
