Renton police form Chief's Community Council

Renton Police Department is asking residents to serve on the initial <u>Chief's Community Council</u>. The council is part of the department's ongoing efforts to engage with, learn from, and build stronger relationships with our community.

Council members will represent our diverse population. Prospective members will be interviewed and selected by the council's steering committee, composed of Renton residents and the chief of police or his designee.

The Chief's Community Council will:

- Develop Community Policing Strategies.
- Provide guidance on equity, transparency, and accountability issues.
- Advise on methods to better serve the public.
- Identify public safety issues.
- Collaborate with community leaders, local organizations, and stakeholders to create practical and effective solutions and equitable community policing practices.

The Chief's Community Council aligns with the city's Business Plan to provide a safe, healthy, and vibrant community. It also expands Renton Police Department's Mission of working together to provide unbiased law enforcement services.

988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline

Starting Saturday, July 16, you can call, text, or chat 988 and connect to the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. The service is free, confidential, and available 24/7/365.

Services are available in English and Spanish. Interpretation services in over 250 languages are also available. For individuals who are deaf, hard of hearing, and TTY users, use your preferred relay service or dial 711 then 1-800-273-8255.

You can dial 988 if you have:

- Thoughts of suicide
- Mental health crises
- Substance use crises
- Any other kind of emotional distress

You can also dial 988 if you are worried about a loved one who may need crisis support.

988 will not replace any crisis call centers in Washington state. Instead, it is in addition to the state's network of crisis center providers. In addition, the current National Suicide Prevention Lifeline number, 1-800-273-TALK (8255), will remain active along with 988.
