

Construction begins February 2018


The City of Renton is moving forward construction of a new fire station and water reservoir in the Kennydale neighborhood on a city-owned parcel at 1404 N 30th St, just west of I-405. Both activities are a collaboration of the Renton Regional Fire Authority (RRFA), Community Services' Facilities Division and the Public Works Department's Utility Systems Division.


Beginning in February 2018, crews will begin construction of Fire Station 15, on the south end of the site, continuing through the end of the year. Fire Station 15 is expected to be operational by January 2019. Reservoir construction will begin early 2019 and is expected to last approximately 12 months. Additional work will be completed on water mains and valves in the right-of-way on NE 30th St, Park Ave N, and N 32nd St, N 33rd St and N 33rd Pl. Overall construction is expected to be complete by early 2020.

What to expect as construction begins

- Vehicles and equipment crews arrive
- · Site clearing and grading
- Foundation/drainage work
- Daytime, weekday construction
 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- Periodic noise, dust, vibration
- Traffic control, as needed

Fire Station 15 is the result of investments in the Renton Regional Fire Authority, approved by voters in spring 2016. The new fire station provides improved response times in the Kennydale neighborhood and the RRFA service area, and relieves current load on Fire Stations 11, 12 and 16.

The reservoir will be co-located on the fire station property to meet a longstanding system need to provide reliability and redundancy of supply, and operational flexibility in the water system. The new reservoir also provides emergency water storage west of I-405.

Opportunity for public art on reservoir

The Renton Municipal Arts Commission will consider options and make recommendations for any painted treatment of the reservoir and invite public feedback through their process. A schedule for meetings related to reservoir public art will be announced on our website and through the project email list.
